Long-term Organ Project Begins With Ground Surveys

We are excited to take the first steps on our long-term project to commission a new quire organ for the Cathedral's east end with initial ground surveys around the chancel. In order to facilitate the work, the Nelson organ we have been renting from charity Pipe Up for Pipe Organs has been removed and sent to its new permanent home in Devonshire. A digital Viscount organ will fill the gap temporarily, while the west end Rieger instrument will continue to be used as normal. We are looking forward to working with the new Organist to move forward in acquiring a fantastic new instrument that will elevate our choral worship and world-class music. CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL CHOIR

When Henry VIII founded Christ Church in 1546 he made provision for the education of a number of boy choristers and a schoolmaster. From these historic roots has grown the current Christ Church Cathedral School, of about 150 pupils aged three to 13, housed in premises built by Dean Liddell (father of Lewis Carroll's 'Alice.') The cathedral choristers are dedicated to their daily music-making, & to the transformational experience that singing in one of the world's most famous choirs brings.
