CHRIST CHURCH CHORISTERS

When Henry VIII founded Christ Church in 1546 he made provision for the education of a number of boy choristers and a schoolmaster. From these historic roots has grown the current Christ Church Cathedral School, of about 150 pupils aged three to 13, housed in premises built by Dean Liddell (father of Lewis Carroll's 'Alice.')

The cathedral choristers are dedicated to their daily music-making, & to the transformational experience that singing in one of the world's most famous choirs brings.

FRIDESWIDE VOICES OF CHRIST CHURCH

Frideswide Voices was the first Anglican choir created specifically for girls of chorister age in Oxford, and was originally formed in October 2014. While they have always had significant links with Christ Church, they became part of the Foundation in September 2019. The girls are drawn from more than 25 different schools across the city and county. They sing Evensong in the Cathedral on most Wednesdays during term-time, as well as singing other services throughout the year.

Festal Evensong of Celebration for 10 years of Frideswide Voices

This autumn, Frideswide Voices mark ten years since their creation and five years since they became part of our choral foundation. In celebration of a decade of providing opportunities for girls to sing liturgical music in Oxford, Evensong on Sunday 22 September will be a Festal Evensong. Our girl choristers make a huge contribution to our choral worship, and we hope you can join us to give thanks for their hard work and beautiful singing over the last ten years!

Coffee and catechesis, Sundays at 10am, from 8 September

Come to the Priory Rooms before the Choral Eucharist for coffee, pastries, and an opportunity for learning and discussion. We start with our series by talking about *Why we go to church*, with discussions of the liturgy, psalms and readings, hymns and sacraments. It will continue most Sundays until just before Advent, with teaching led by the Regius Professor of Divinity, College Chaplain, Sub Dean, Precentor, and Priest Vicar. After Christmas, we will consider the Creeds.

The Revd Canon Dr Sally Welch to take up new role as Rector of Kington

The Revd Canon Dr Sally Welch, our Diocesan Canon, has been appointed as Rector of the Benefice of Kington St Mary with Huntington, Old Radnor, Kinnerton and Titley in the Diocese of Hereford. Sally has been part of our Cathedral community since September 2022, and also served as one of the Bishop's Advisers for women's ministry. As she prepares for this next stage in her ministry, we hold Sally and her family in our prayers and we pray also for the people of the five Kington parishes as they look forward to her arrival.
