Choral Eucharist

Sundays at 11am, with seating for members of the House in the Chancel (as per Evensong).

Members of the House are especially welcome to the weekly Choral Eucharist, which runs both in Full Term and the short and long Vacations. During term time we gather for (free) breakfast together in Hall beforehand, from 10am. All are warmly welcome, regardless of denomination.

University Sermon – Feast of Pentecost (8 June)

At the Choral Eucharist on Sunday of 7th Week, join us for some celebratory pomp with University dignitaries and a sermon from the Revd Canon Dr Victoria Johnson, Dean of Chapel at St John's College, Cambridge.

House Communion – Thursday 4th Week

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea, which met in 325 AD to help settle crucial questions of the faith. To mark this anniversary, our House Communion this term will have an ecumenical theme.

Our preacher is the Revd Canon Dr **Jeremy Morris** who is the National Advisor for Ecumenical Relations for the Church of England, a role in which he works with a variety of churches nationally and internationally in the pursuit of visible church unity. He is also an academic, working in ecclesiastical history.
