THE CHORAL FOUNDATION OF CHRIST CHURCH:

THE CATHEDRAL CHOIR

When Henry VIII founded Christ Church in 1546 he made provision for the education of a number of boy choristers and a schoolmaster. From these historic roots has grown the current Christ Church Cathedral School, of about 150 pupils aged three to 13, housed in premises built by Dean Liddell (father of Lewis Carroll's 'Alice.') The cathedral choristers are dedicated to their daily music-making, & to the transformational experience that singing in one of the world's most famous choirs brings.

The Lay and Academical Clerks, as part of the choral foundation at Christ Church, sing with the boy choristers, and with Frideswide Voices, at services throughout the year. The Lay Clerks are professional singers, whilst the Academical Clerks are undergraduates reading for a degree at the University of Oxford. The Organist, Peter Holder, and Christ Church Cathedral School welcome enquiries at any time about being a chorister at Christ Church. FRIDESWIDE VOICES

Frideswide Voices was the first Anglican choir created specifically for girls of chorister age in Oxford, and was originally formed in October 2014. While they have always had significant links with Christ Church, they became part of the Foundation in September 2019. The girls are drawn from more than 25 different schools across the city and county. They sing Evensong in the Cathedral on most Wednesdays during term-time, as well as singing other services throughout the year.

UPCOMING EVENTS IN THE CATHEDRAL

The Feast of the Epiphany, 5 and 6 January

The twelve days of Christmas come to a close with the Feast of the Epiphany, when we celebrate Jesus' manifestation to the gentiles in the form of the arrival of the magi. On Monday 5 January, there will be an extra service of Choral Evensong for the Eve of Epiphany, followed on 6 January at 6.05pm with the Choral Eucharist for the Feast of the Epiphany. At the end of this service, you can take away a piece of blessed chalk to write the traditional Epiphany blessing at your doorway when you get home.

6.05pm Saturday 17 January: Three Wonders Mark This Holy Time: A Service for the Epiphany Season

The Epiphany season celebrates, in addition to the Visit of the Magi, Jesus' baptism and first miracle. These 'three wonders' form the basis of a service of readings and music sung by the Cathedral Choir, to which you are warmly invited.

12.30pm Sunday 18 January: Congregational Meeting

A Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday 18 January after Choral Eucharist. This is an opportunity to hear from various members of Cathedral Staff regarding their latest projects and what has occurred behind-the-scenes since the previous meeting. We also invite you to ask questions and chat with staff, whether they be the clergy you see every week, or the administrative team who are usually squirrelled away in an office! A sandwich lunch will be served.

6.05pm Saturday 31 January: Choral Evensong with the Installation of Honorary Canons

The Dean and Chapter of Christ Church welcome you to this special service, at which we celebrate the ministries of those being admitted as Honorary Canons of Christ Church Cathedral. Do join us to give thanks for their many years of service to the Church and God's people in and around this Diocese and the whole Church of England. This service will be followed by a drinks reception at which you will have the chance to speak to the newly installed Honorary Canons.

Candlemas, 1 February

The Christmas and Epiphany season comes to a close with the Feast of Candlemas, when, 40 days after the birth of Jesus, we celebrate his Presentation in the Temple, and his revelation as 'a light to the nations and the glory of God's people'.

Cathedral Pilgrimage to Iona, 18–25 July 2026

It is with great pleasure that we announce this pilgrimage and retreat for the Cathedral community to the beautiful island of Iona (where St Columba began his ministry and mission to Scotland in around 563 AD) from Saturday 18th – Saturday 25th July 2026. There is limited capacity for a maximum of 18 people, offered on a “first come first served basis” on receipt of a deposit. The cost depends on numbers attending but is likely to fall within the range of £800–£1200, and substantial grants are available for under 30s.
